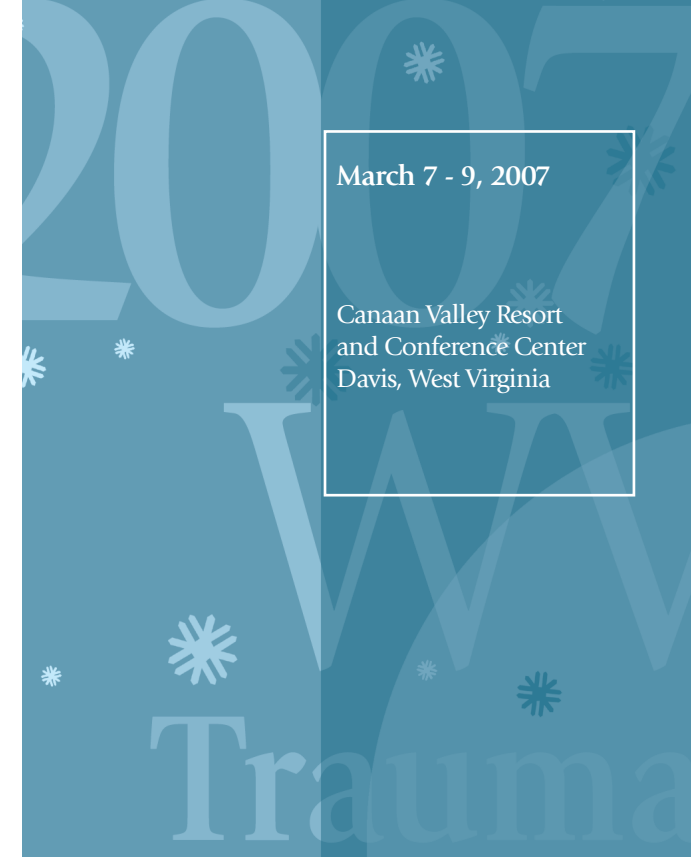

Location

Perched on the northern edge of the majestic Allegheny Mountains, 3,200 feet above sea level, the four-season Canaan Valley Resort and Conference Center boasts more than 6,000 acres of woodlands, meadows and rolling hills.
